Reinforce Understanding

6.2 Small Group • Group 1

With my small group, I can divide a fraction by a fraction and divide with mixed numbers by multiplying by the reciprocal — one step at a time, with support.

Worked model

A pitcher holds $\frac{8}{9}$ liter of lemonade. Each glass takes $\frac{2}{9}$ liter. How many glasses can be filled?

1. Write the division. $\frac{8}{9} \div \frac{2}{9}$
2. Keep, Change, Flip. Keep $\frac{8}{9}$, change $\div$ to $\times$, flip the divisor to $\frac{9}{2}$
3. Multiply across. $\frac{8}{9} \times \frac{9}{2} = \frac{72}{18}$
4. Simplify. $\frac{72}{18} = 4$ glasses

Answer: The pitcher fills 4 glasses that each hold $\frac{2}{9}$ liter.
